### FORTHCOMING PRODUCTIONS

Hot on the heels of 'Stones in his Pockets', rehearsals have just started for our May production, 'Trestle' by Stewart Pringle, winner of the 2017 Papatango New Writing Prize. This is a bittersweet comic drama about later life, love and community. Harry and Denise meet by chance at the village hall. They are both of a certain age. For Harry, life is beginning to tick down, his autumn years spent quietly caring for the community he loves. Denise thinks life begins in retirement and she's dancing like she's still at high school. The play is directed by Richard Greenhorn, a long-standing member of the Players.

Our Festival 2024 production is the much loved '*Cider with Rosie*' by Laurie Lee. This charming autobiographical play with music charts Lee's early years growing up in a Gloucestershire village after the First World War. This is an ensemble piece and we welcome to the stage no fewer than 14 actors, many of them new to the Players. Following her very successful production of '*Kindertransport*' last year, Gill Lambourn is very much looking forward to directing this beautiful and very challenging play in the Arundel Festival at the end of August.

Continuing the series, 'Short Cuts at the Priory', our one act play in the Arundel Festival this year will be 'Surplus Women', written by Stuart Smithers and directed by Helen Harries-Rees. The play is a 'shared monologue' and follows the trials and tribulations of a First World War widow. This is once again presented in collaboration with Drip Action's Theatre Trail.

Next up we have our October production, 'The Suspicions of Mr Whicher' adapted for the stage by Alexandra Wood, from the book by Kate Summerscale. Auditions will be held on 15th May and full details appear in the Audition Notice set out below. For this her debut production with the Players, we welcome a very experienced director, Yasmin Nixon, who will be looking for eight or more actors to bring this intriguing Victorian murder mystery to life. The available parts vary in size and complexity so why not come along and try your hand. Yasmin is keen to nurture new talent!

# AUDITION NOTICE THE SUSPICIONS OF MR WHICHER

(adapted for the stage by Alexandra Wood)

Directed by Yasmin Nixon

Audition Date: **WEDNESDAY 15th MAY AT 7.00 PM**. Performance Dates: **21st – 26th October 2024** 

It is the Summer of 1860 and in the outside privy of an elegant country house the dead body of a small boy is found, strangled and stabbed. Shockingly, clues point to the murderer being a member of his well to do family.

Celebrated detective Jonathan Whicher from Scotland Yard is called to investigate but this case challenges him in ways he never expected.

20 years later, still haunted by the case and on the eve of his retirement, Whicher visits the murderer and as they replay the past the terrible truth is revealed.

The Suspicions of Mr Whicher is an adaptation of the 2008 novel by Kate Summerscale; it was also made into a TV mini-series, airing in 2013/14.

There is a cast of 20 plus characters: Maids, a cook, a Policeman, a Governess, a Vicar and even a nun!

Rehearsals will begin in late August / September 2024 and rehearsal evenings will vary according to cast availability.

In the original stage production of 2023, eight actors (4m and 4f) told this intriguing story, many playing different age ranges – from 15 to 60. There are some lovely character parts with plenty of opportunity for drama and intrigue. Parts are also adaptable to accommodate a smaller or larger cast and there are opportunities for anyone new to acting who would like a small part.

Two characters, one male (Jonathan Whicher) - approximately 50-60) and one female (Constance who is in her late 30s but reenacts scenes as a young girl and a young woman), remain the same throughout the play.
